This machine is intended to be used only to lift personnel, along with their tools, and materials to an aerial work site.

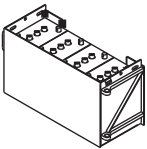
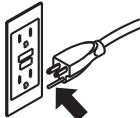
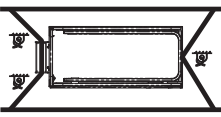
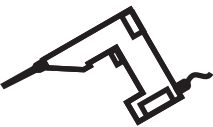
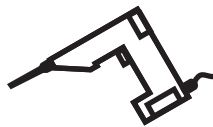
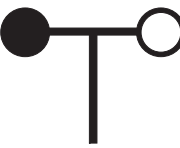
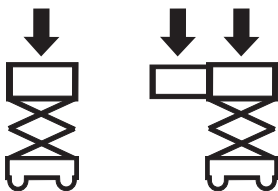
## Safety Sign Maintenance

2. Press and hold the distributor function enable switch on the control handle. Move the control handle off center and immediately release it to reset the brakes.

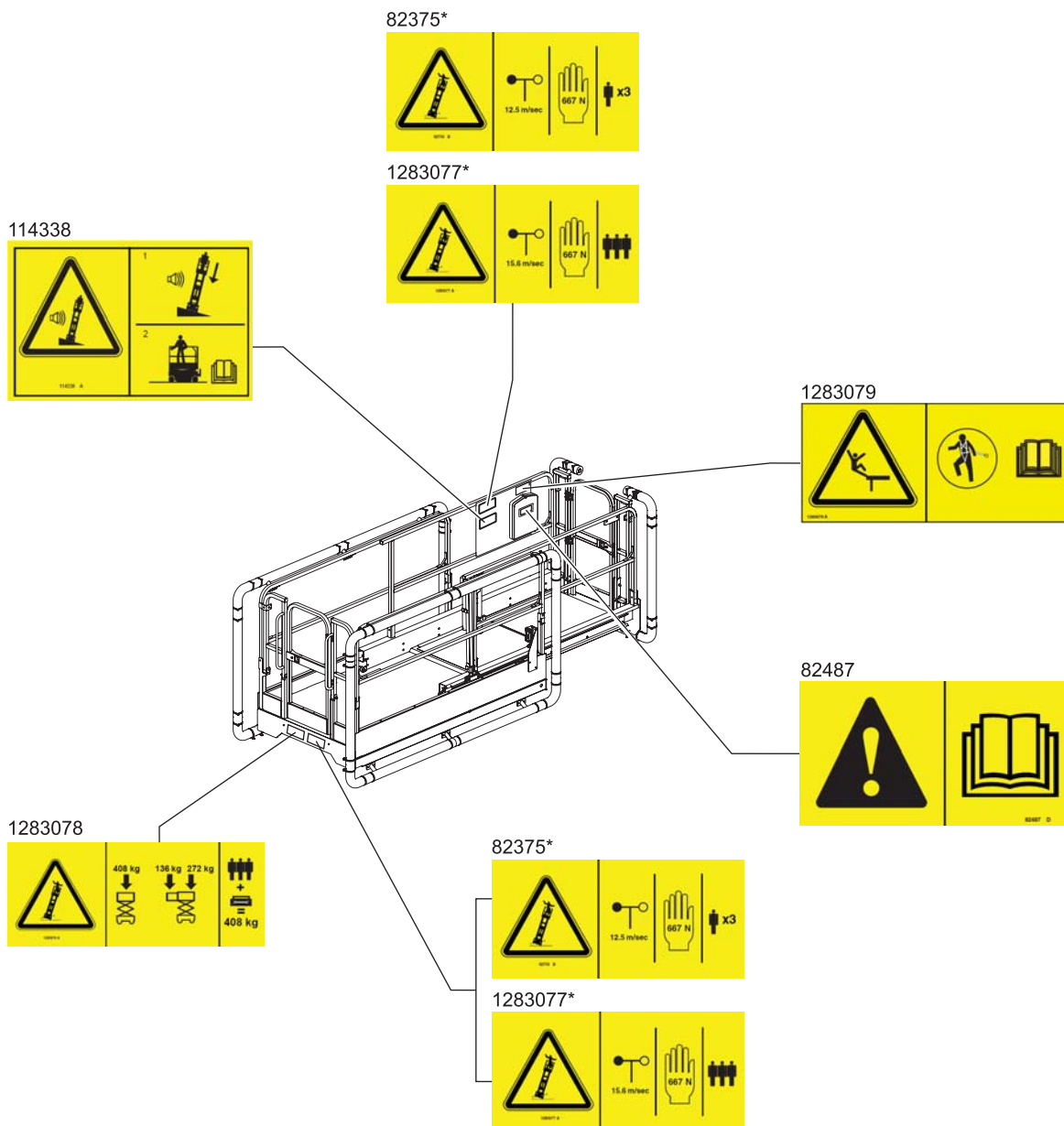

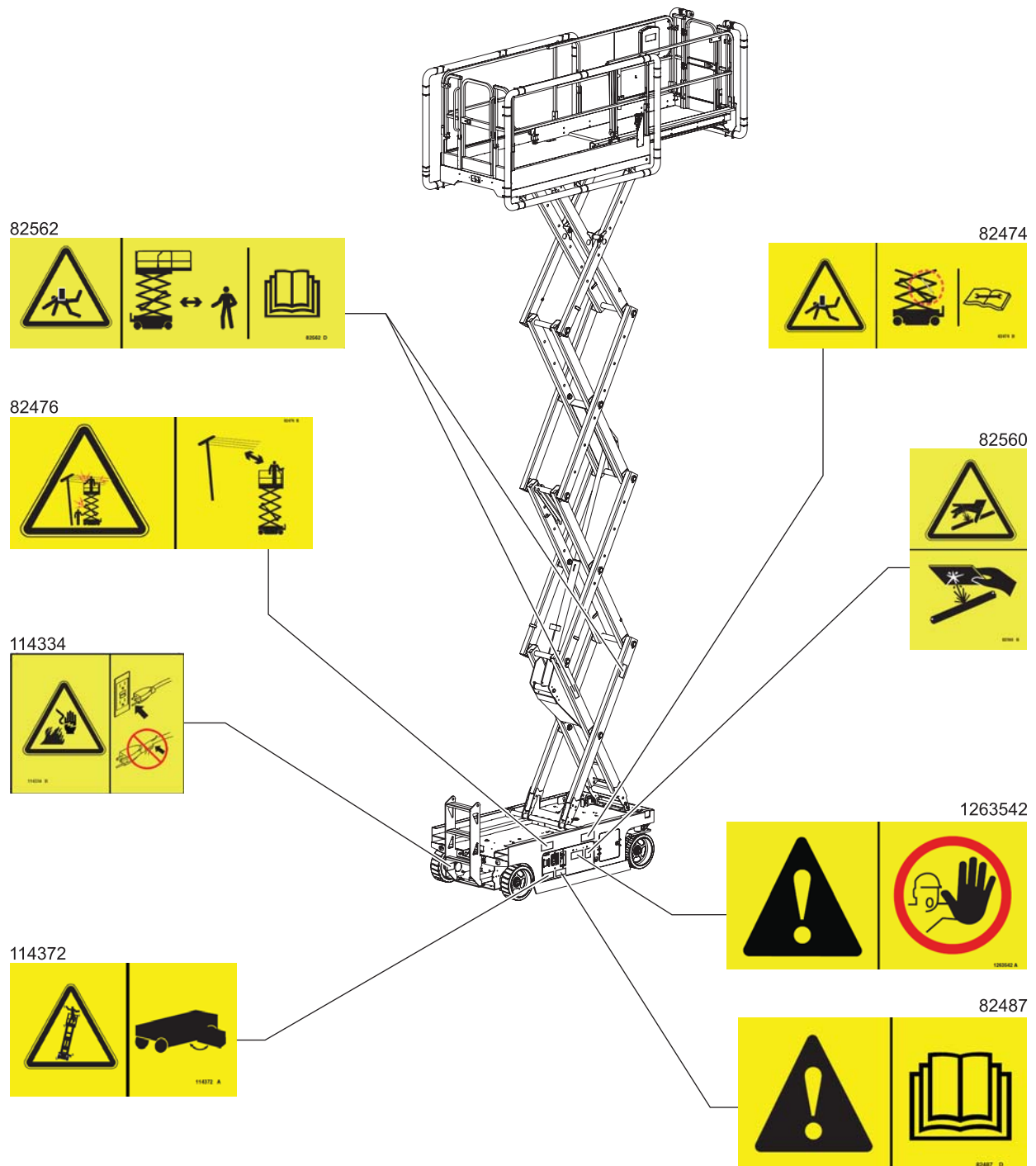

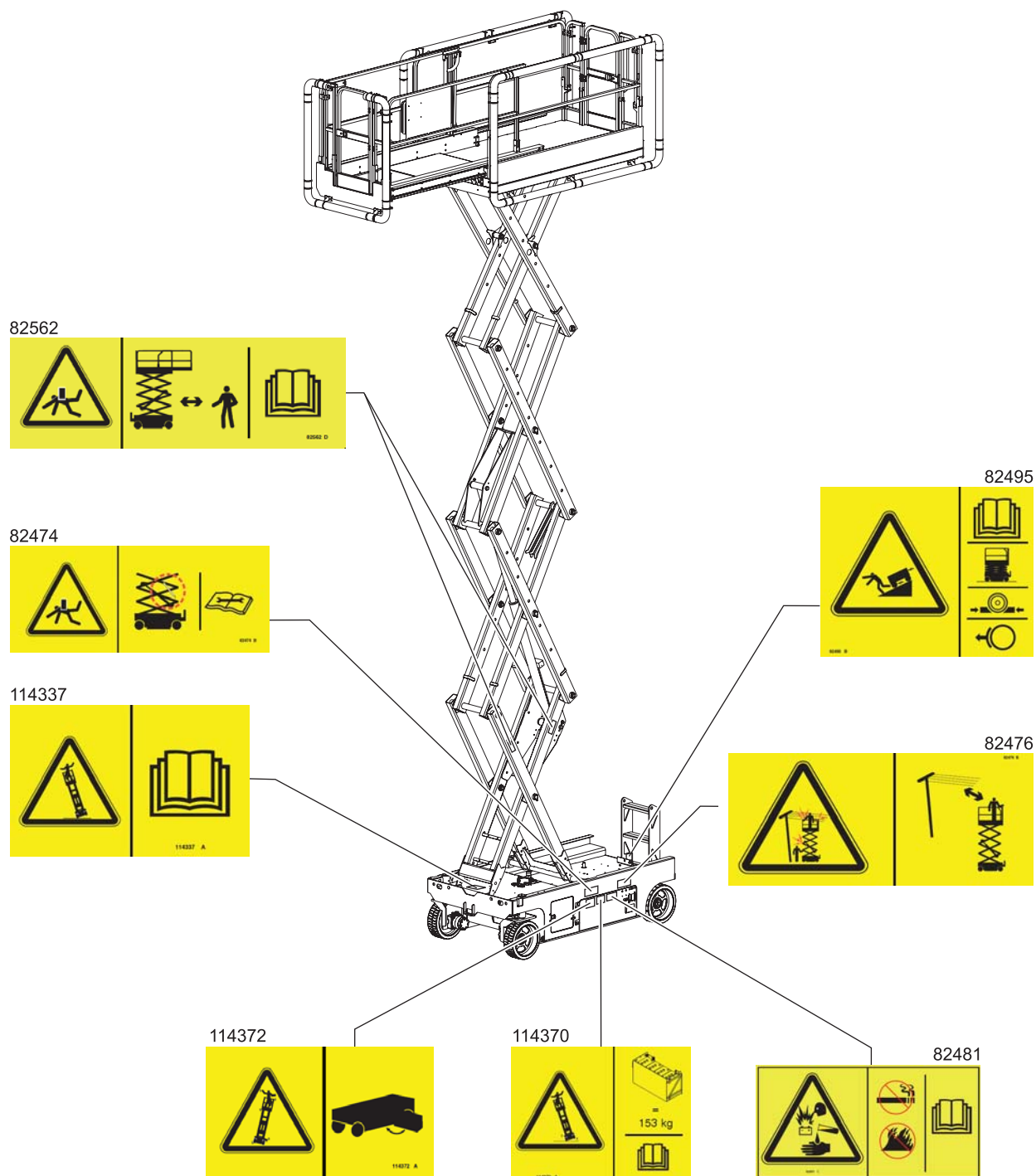

# Personal Safety

## Personal Fall Protection

Personal fall protection equipment (PFPE) is not required when operating this machine provided the operator remains inside the perimeter of the platform guardrail system. If PFPE is required by job site or employer rules, the following shall apply:

All PFPE must comply with applicable governmental regulations and must be inspected and used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

### Requirements for Exiting an Elevated Work Platform

Operators must use personal fall protection equipment when exiting and entering an elevated platform through the front gate. When exiting or entering an elevated platform, the platform must be positioned as close as possible to the surface of the exit or entry point, but not more than 12 inches / 30 cm away from the surface of the exit or entry point.

Operators are required to wear approved PFPE at all times when exiting and entering an elevated platform through the front gate, and must use a lanyard designed to allow 100% tie-off when exiting and entering an elevated platform through the front gate.

Do not exit or enter an elevated platform through the rear gate.

### Exiting an Elevated Platform Through the Front Gate

- 1 Attach primary lanyard to a platform anchor point.
- 2 Attach secondary lanyard to an approved adjacent anchor point.
- 3 Detach the primary lanyard from the platform anchor point.

The primary lanyard can not remain attached to the platform anchor point after attaching the secondary lanyard to the adjacent anchor point.

Do not operate the machine while the secondary lanyard is attached to the adjacent anchor point.

### Entering an Elevated Platform Through the Front Gate

- 1 Attach primary lanyard to a platform anchor point.
- 2 Detach secondary lanyard from the adjacent anchor point.
- 3 Detach the primary lanyard from the platform anchor point.

## Work Area Safety

### ⚠ Electrocuting Hazards

This machine is not electrically insulated and will not provide protection from contact with or proximity to electrical current.



Obey all local and governmental regulations regarding required clearance from electrical power lines. At a minimum, the required clearance contained in the chart below must be followed.

Allow for platform movement, electrical line sway or sag, and beware of strong or gusty winds.



Keep away from the machine if it contacts energized power lines. Personnel on the ground or in the platform must not touch or operate the machine until energized power lines are shut off.

Do not operate the machine during lightning or storms.

Do not use the machine as a ground for welding.

### ⚠ Tip-over Hazards

Occupants, equipment and materials shall not exceed the maximum platform capacity or the maximum platform capacity of the platform extension.

## Work Area Safety



Do not raise the platform unless the machine is on a firm, level surface.



Do not depend on the tilt alarm as a level indicator. The tilt alarm sounds on the chassis only when the machine is on a severe slope.

If the tilt alarm sounds:

Lower the platform. Move the machine to a firm, level surface. If the tilt alarm sounds when the platform is raised, use extreme caution to lower the platform.

Do not drive over 0.5 mph / 0.8 km/h with the platform raised.

### GS-2646 AV

Do not raise the platform when wind speeds may exceed 28 mph / 12.5 m/s. If wind speeds exceed 28 mph / 12.5 m/s when the platform is raised, lower the platform and do not continue to operate the machine. Refer to instructional decal and serial label for specific wind speed rating.

### GS-2646 AV35

Do not raise the platform when wind speeds may exceed 35 mph / 15.6 m/s. If wind speeds exceed 35 mph / 15.6 m/s when the platform is raised, lower the platform and do not continue to operate the machine. Refer to instructional decal and serial label for specific wind speed rating.



Do not operate the machine in strong or gusty winds. Do not increase the surface area of the platform or the load. Increasing the area exposed to the wind will decrease machine stability.



Use extreme care and slow speeds while driving the machine in the stowed position across uneven terrain, debris, unstable or slippery surfaces and near holes and drop-offs.

## Work Area Safety

Do not drive the machine on or near uneven terrain, unstable surfaces or other hazardous conditions with the platform raised.

Do not use the machine as a crane.

Do not push the machine or other objects with the platform.

Do not contact adjacent structures with the platform.

Do not tie the platform to adjacent structures.

Do not place loads outside the platform perimeter.

Do not operate the machine with the chassis trays open.



Do not push off or pull toward any object outside of the platform.

Do not alter or disable the limit switches or proximity switches.

Do not alter or disable machine components that in any way affect safety and stability.

Do not replace items critical to machine stability with items of different weight or specification.

Do not use batteries that weigh less than the original equipment. Batteries are used as counterweight and are critical to machine stability. Each battery must weigh 65 lbs / 29.5 kg. Battery tray including batteries must weigh a minimum of 335 lbs / 152 kg.

Do not modify or alter an aerial work platform without prior written permission from the manufacturer. Mounting attachments for holding tools or other materials onto the platform, toeboards, or guard rail system can increase the weight in the platform and the surface area of the platform or the load.



Do not place or attach fixed or overhanging loads to any part of this machine.



Do not place ladders or scaffolds in the platform or against any part of this machine.

Do not transport tools and materials unless they are evenly distributed and can be safely handled by person(s) in the platform.

Do not use the machine on a moving or mobile surface or vehicle.

Be sure all tires are in good condition, castle nuts are properly tightened and cotter pins are properly installed.

## Work Area Safety

### ⚠️ Crushing Hazard

Keep hands and limbs out of scissors.

Keep hands clear when folding rails.

Do not work under the platform or in the scissor links without the safety arm in place.

Use common sense and planning when operating the machine with the controller from the ground. Maintain safe distances between the operator, the machine and fixed objects.

### ⚠️ Operation on Slopes Hazards

Do not drive the machine on a slope that exceeds the slope and side slope rating of the machine. Slope rating applies to machines in the stowed position.

Note: Slope rating is subject to ground conditions and adequate traction.

### ⚠️ Fall Hazards

The guard rail system provides fall protection. If occupant(s) of the platform are required to wear personal fall protection equipment (PFPE) due to job site or employer rules, PFPE and its use shall be in accordance with the PFPE manufacturer's instructions and applicable governmental requirements. Use approved lanyard attachment point provided.



Do not sit, stand, or climb on the platform guard rails. Maintain a firm footing on the platform floor at all times.



Do not climb down from the platform when raised.

Keep the platform floor clear of debris.

Do not enter or exit the platform through the rear gate, unless the machine is in the stowed position. Follow the procedure on page 8 to exit or enter an elevated platform through the front gate.

Close the entry gates before operating.

Do not operate the machine unless the guard rails are properly installed and the entries are secured for operation.

## Work Area Safety

### ⚠ Collision Hazards



Be aware of limited sight distance and blind spots when driving or operating.

Be aware of extended platform position when moving the machine.

The machine must be on a level surface or secured before releasing the brakes.

Operators must comply with employer, job site, and governmental rules regarding use of personal protective equipment.



Check the work area for overhead obstructions or other possible hazards.



Be aware of crushing hazards when grasping the platform guard rail.

Observe and use color-coded direction arrows on the platform controls and the platform decal plate for drive and steer functions.



Do not lower the platform unless the area below is clear of personnel and obstructions.



Limit travel speed according to the condition of the ground surface, congestion, slope, location of personnel, and any other factors which may cause collision.

Do not operate a machine in the path of any crane or moving overhead machinery unless the controls of the crane have been locked out and/or precautions have been taken to prevent any potential collision.

No stunt driving or horseplay while operating a machine.

## Work Area Safety

### **⚠ Bodily Injury Hazard**

Do not operate the machine with a hydraulic oil or air leak. An air leak or hydraulic leak can penetrate and/or burn skin.

Improper contact with components under any cover will cause serious injury. Only trained maintenance personnel should access compartments. Access by the operator is only advised when performing a pre-operation inspection. All compartments must remain closed and secured during operation.

### **⚠ Explosion and Fire Hazards**

Do not operate the machine or charge the battery in hazardous locations or locations where potentially flammable or explosive gases or particles may be present.

### **⚠ Damaged Machine Hazards**

Do not use a damaged or malfunctioning machine.

Conduct a thorough pre-operation inspection of the machine and test all functions before each work shift. Immediately tag and remove from service a damaged or malfunctioning machine.

Be sure all maintenance has been performed as specified in this manual and the appropriate Genie service manual.

Be sure all decals are in place and legible.

Be sure the operator's, safety, and responsibilities manuals are complete, legible, and in the storage container located on the machine.

### **⚠ Component Damage Hazards**

Do not use any battery charger greater than 24V to charge the batteries.

Do not use the machine as a ground for welding.

## Work Area Safety

### ⚠ Battery Safety

#### Burn Hazards

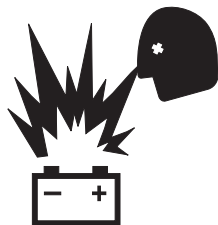


Batteries contain acid. Always wear protective clothing and eye wear when working with batteries.

Avoid spilling or contacting battery acid. Neutralize battery acid spills with baking soda and water.

Do not expose the batteries or the charger to water or rain during charging.

#### Explosion Hazards



Keep sparks, flames, and lighted tobacco away from batteries. Batteries emit explosive gas.

The battery tray should remain open during the entire charging cycle.



Do not contact the battery terminals or the cable clamps with tools that may cause sparks.



### Component Damage Hazard

Do not use any battery charger greater than 24V to charge the batteries.

### Electrocution/Burn Hazards



Connect the battery charger to a grounded, AC 3-wire electrical outlet only.

Inspect daily for damaged cords, cables and wires. Replace damaged items before operating.

Avoid electrical shock from contact with battery terminals. Remove all rings, watches and other jewelry.

### Tip-over Hazard

Do not use batteries that weigh less than the original equipment. Batteries are used as counterweight and are critical to machine stability. Each battery must weigh 65 lbs / 29.5 kg. Battery tray including batteries must weigh a minimum of 335 lbs / 152 kg.

### Lifting Hazard

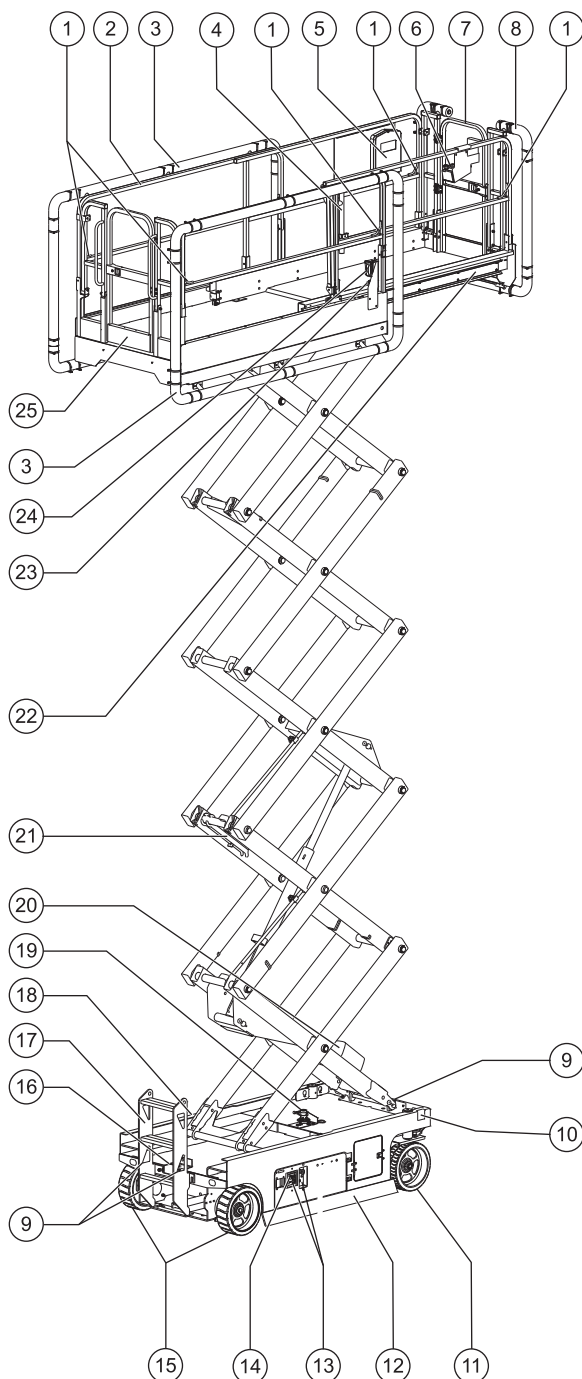
Use the appropriate number of people and proper lifting techniques when lifting batteries.

### Lockout After Each Use

- 1 Select a safe parking location—firm level surface, clear of obstruction and traffic.
- 2 Lower the platform.
- 3 Turn the selector switch to the off position. If equipped, remove the key.
- 4 Disconnect the battery pack and lock the battery tray to secure from unauthorized use.
- 5 Charge the batteries.

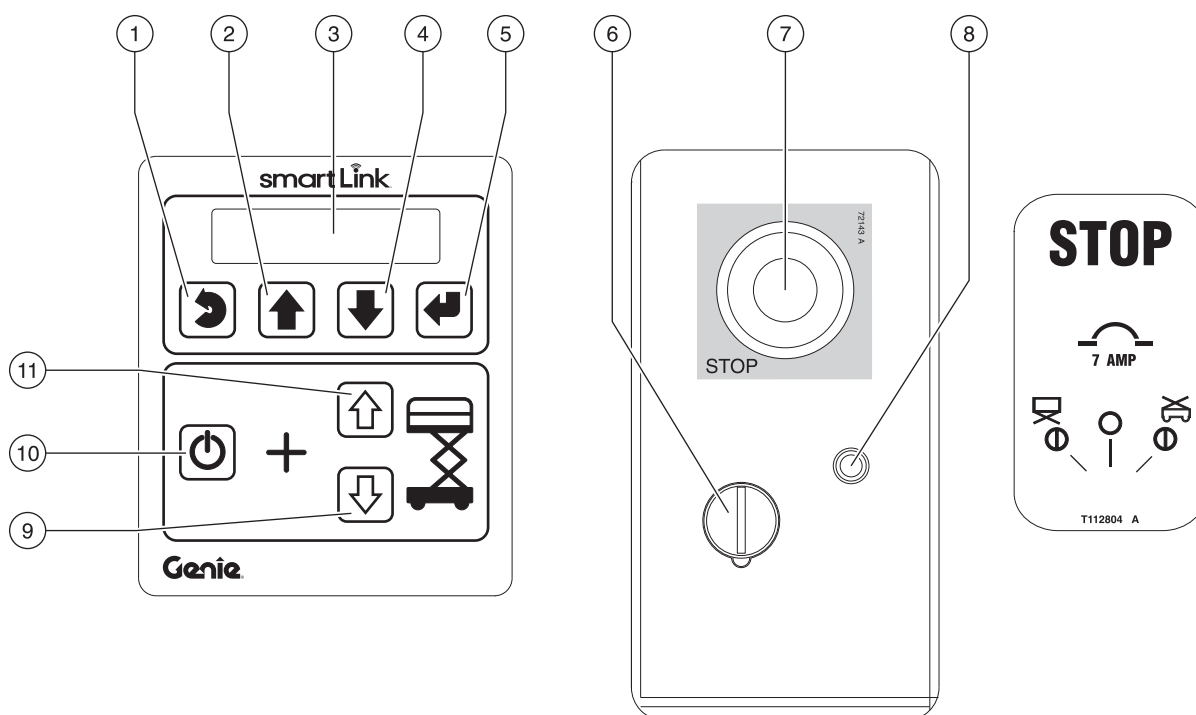

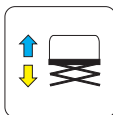
## Platform Control Panel

### 1 Red Emergency Stop button

Push in the red Emergency Stop button to the off position to stop all functions. Pull out the red Emergency Stop button to the on position to operate the machine.

### 2 Lift function button

Push this button to activate the lift function.



### 3 Horn button

Press this button and the horn will sound. Release the button and the horn will stop.

### 4 Drive speed select button

Press this button to activate the slow drive function. The indicator light will be on when slow drive is selected.



## Controls

- 5 Proportional control handle and function enable switch for drive, steer, lift and platform extend/retract functions

Lift function: Press and hold the function enable switch to enable the lift function on the platform control handle. Move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow and the platform will raise. Move the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow and the platform will lower. The descent alarm should sound while the platform is lowering.

Drive function: Press and hold the function enable switch to enable the drive function on the platform control handle. Move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow on the control panel and the machine will move in the direction that the blue arrow points. Move the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow on the control panel and the machine will move in the direction that the yellow arrow points.

Platform extend/retract function: Press and hold the function enable switch to enable the platform extend/retract function on the platform control handle. Move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow and the platform will extend. Move the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow and the platform will retract.

- 6 Thumb rocker switch for steer function

Press the left side of the thumb rocker and the machine will turn in the direction the blue triangle points on the platform control panel.



Press the right side of the thumb rocker and the machine will turn in the direction the yellow triangle points on the platform control panel.

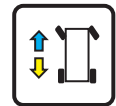

## Pre-operation Inspection Fundamentals

It is the responsibility of the operator to perform a pre-operation inspection and routine maintenance.

The pre-operation inspection is a visual inspection performed by the operator prior to each work shift. The inspection is designed to discover if anything is apparently wrong with a machine before the operator performs the function tests.

The pre-operation inspection also serves to determine if routine maintenance procedures are required. Only routine maintenance items specified in this manual may be performed by the operator.

Refer to the list on the next page and check each of the items.

If damage or any unauthorized variation from factory delivered condition is discovered, the machine must be tagged and removed from service.

Repairs to the machine may only be made by a qualified service technician, according to the manufacturer's specifications. After repairs are completed, the operator must perform a pre-operation inspection again before going on to the function tests.

Scheduled maintenance inspections shall be performed by qualified service technicians, according to the manufacturer's specifications and the requirements listed in the responsibilities manual.

## Pre-operation Inspection

- ☐ Be sure that the operator's, safety, and responsibilities manuals are complete, legible and in the storage container located in the platform.
- ☐ Be sure that all decals are legible and in place. See Inspections section.
- ☐ Check for hydraulic oil leaks and proper oil level. Add oil if needed. See Maintenance section.
- ☐ Check for battery fluid leaks and proper fluid level. Add distilled water if needed. See Maintenance section.

Check the following components or areas for damage, improperly installed, or missing parts and unauthorized modifications:

- ☐ Electrical components, wiring, and electrical cables
- ☐ Hydraulic hoses, fittings, cylinders, and manifolds
- ☐ Drive motors
- ☐ Wear pads
- ☐ Tires and wheels
- ☐ Limit switches, proximity switches, alarms and horn
- ☐ Alarms and beacons (if equipped)
- ☐ Nuts, bolts and other fasteners
- ☐ Brake release components
- ☐ Safety arm
- ☐ Platform extension
- ☐ Scissor pins and retaining fasteners
- ☐ Platform control joystick

- ☐ Outrigger housing and footpads (if equipped)
- ☐ Battery pack and connections
- ☐ Ground strap
- ☐ Platform entry chain or gate
- ☐ Pothole guards
- ☐ Lanyard anchorage points

Check entire machine for:

- ☐ Cracks in welds or structural components
- ☐ Dents or damage to machine
- ☐ Excessive rust, corrosion or oxidation
- ☐ Be sure that all structural and other critical components are present and all associated fasteners and pins are in place and properly tightened.
- ☐ Be sure side rails are installed and bolts are fastened.
- ☐ Be sure that the chassis trays are closed and latched and the batteries are properly connected.

Note: If the platform must be raised to inspect the machine, make sure the safety arm is in place. See Operating Instructions section.

## Function Test Fundamentals

The function tests are designed to discover any malfunctions before the machine is put into service. The operator must follow the step-by-step instructions to test all machine functions.

A malfunctioning machine must never be used. If malfunctions are discovered, the machine must be tagged and removed from service. Repairs to the machine may only be made by a qualified service technician, according to the manufacturer's specifications.

After repairs are completed, the operator must perform a pre-operation inspection and function tests again before putting the machine into service.

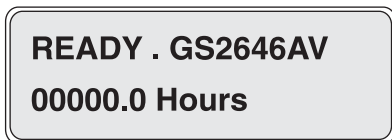
# Inspections

## At the Ground Controls

- 1 Select a test area that is firm, level and free of obstruction.
- 2 Be sure the batteries are connected.
- 3 Pull out the platform and ground red Emergency Stop button to the on position.
- 4 Turn the selector switch to ground control.
- 5 Observe the diagnostic LED readout on the platform controls.
- ⊙ Result: The LED should look like the picture below.



- 6 Observe the diagnostic LCD readout on the ground controls.
- ⊙ Result: The LCD should display the model and hour meter.



## Test Emergency Stop

- 7 Push in the ground red Emergency Stop button to the off position.
- ⊙ Result: No functions should operate.
- 8 Pull out the red Emergency Stop button to the on position.

## Test the Up/Down Functions

The audible warnings on this machine and the standard horn all come from the same central alarm. The horn is a constant tone. The descent alarm sounds at 60 beeps per minute. The alarm sounds at 180 beeps per minute when the pothole guards have not deployed and when the machine is not level. An optional automotive-style horn is also available.

- 9 Do not press the lift function enable button.
- 10 Press the platform up or platform down button.
- ⊙ Result: The lift function should not operate.
- 11 Do not press the platform up or platform down buttons.
- 12 Press the lift function enable button.
- ⊙ Result: The lift function should not operate.
- 13 Press and hold the lift function enable button, and press the platform up button.
- ⊙ Result: The platform should raise.
- 14 Press and hold the lift function enable button, and press the platform down button.
- ⊙ Result: The platform should lower. The descent alarm should sound while the platform is lowering.

# Inspections

## Test Emergency Lowering

- 15 Activate the up function by pressing the lift enable button and platform up button, and raise the platform approximately 2 ft. / 60 cm.
- 16 Pull the emergency lowering knob located on the ground controls side of the machine, at the steer end.
- ⊙ Result: The platform should lower. The descent alarm will not sound.
- 17 Turn the selector switch to platform control.

## At the Platform Controls

### Test Emergency Stop

- 18 Push in the platform red Emergency Stop button to the off position.
- ⊙ Result: No functions should operate.

### Test the Horn

- 19 Pull out the red Emergency Stop button to the on position.
- 20 Press the horn button.
- ⊙ Result: The horn should sound.

## Test the Function Enable Switch and the Up/Down Functions

- 21 Do not hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 22 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
- ⊙ Result: No functions should operate.
- 23 Press the lift function button.
- 24 Wait seven seconds for the lift function to time out.
- 25 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
- ⊙ Result: The lift function should not operate.
- 26 Press the lift function button.
- 27 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle. Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow.
- ⊙ Result: The platform should raise.
- 28 Release the control handle.
- ⊙ Result: The platform should stop raising.
- 29 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle. Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
- ⊙ Result: The platform should lower. The descent alarm should sound while the platform is lowering.

## Inspections

### Test the Powered Extension Deck Extend/Retract Functions (if equipped)

- 30 Press the powered extension deck function button.
- 31 Wait seven seconds for the powered extension deck function to time out.
- 32 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
  - ⦿ Result: The platform extension deck function should not operate.
- 33 Press the powered extension deck function button.
- 34 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle. Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow.
  - ⦿ Result: The powered extension deck should extend. If equipped, the motion alarm should sound during extension deck movement.
- 35 Release the control handle.
  - ⦿ Result: The powered extension deck should stop.
- 36 Press the lift function button.

- 37 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
  - ⦿ Result: The lift function should not operate.
- 38 Press the powered extension deck function button.
- 39 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle. Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
  - ⦿ Result: The powered extension deck should retract. If equipped, the motion alarm should sound during extension deck movement.

### Test the Steering

Note: When performing the steer and drive function tests, stand in the platform facing the steer end of the machine.

- 40 Press the drive function button (if equipped). 
- 41 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 42 Press the thumb rocker switch on top of the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue triangle on the control panel.
  - ⦿ Result: The steer wheels should turn in the direction indicated by the blue triangle.
- 43 Press the thumb rocker switch on top of the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow triangle, on the control panel.
  - ⦿ Result: The steer wheels should turn in the direction indicated by the yellow triangle.

## Test the Drive Function Button

- 44 Press the drive function button.



- 45 Wait seven seconds for the drive function to time out.
- 46 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.

- ⊙ Result: No functions should operate.

## Test Drive and Braking

- 47 Press the drive function button (if equipped).



- 48 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 49 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow on the control panel until the machine begins to move, then return the control handle to the center position.

- ⊙ Result: The machine should move in the direction that the blue arrow points on the control panel, then come to an abrupt stop when the control handle is returned to the center position.
- 50 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow on the control panel until the machine begins to move, then return the control handle to the center position.
- ⊙ Result: The machine should move in the direction that the yellow arrow points on the control panel, then come to an abrupt stop when the control handle is returned to the center position.

Note: The brakes must be able to hold the machine on any slope it is able to climb.

## Test the Entry Gate Cut-out Function

- 51 Raise the platform approximately 4 ft / 1.2 m from the ground.
- 52 Extend the powered extension deck 2 ft / 0.6 m (if equipped).
- 53 Open the rear entry gate and prop open.

- 54 Press the drive function button (if equipped).



- 55 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 56 Slowly move the drive control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, and then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
- ⊙ Result: The machine should not move in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, or the yellow arrow.
- 57 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 58 Press the thumb rocker switch on top of the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue triangle, and then in the direction indicated by the yellow triangle.
- ⊙ Result: The steer wheels should not turn in the direction indicated by the blue triangle, or the yellow triangle.
- 59 Activate the platform up function, and the platform down function.
- ⊙ Result: The platform up function and the platform down function should not operate.
- 60 Activate the platform extend function, and the platform retract function.
- ⊙ Result: The platform extend function and the platform retract function should not work.

# Inspections

- 61 Close the rear entry gate.
- 62 Open the front entry gate and prop open.
- 63 Press the drive function button (if equipped). 
- 64 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 65 Slowly move the drive control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, and then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
- ⊙ Result: The machine should not move in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, or the yellow arrow.
- 66 Press and hold the drive/steer function enable switch on the control handle.
- 67 Press the thumb rocker switch on top of the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue triangle, and then in the direction indicated by the yellow triangle.
- ⊙ Result: The steer wheels should not turn in the direction indicated by the blue triangle, or the yellow triangle.
- 68 Activate the platform up function, and the platform down function.
- ⊙ Result: The platform up function and the platform down function should not operate.
- 69 Activate the platform extend function, and the platform retract function.
- ⊙ Result: The platform extend function and the platform retract function should not work.
- 70 Close the front entry gate.
- 71 Fully retract the powered extension deck to the stowed position (if equipped).

Fully lower the platform to the stowed position.

## Test the Tilt Sensor Operation

Note: Perform this test from the ground with the platform controller. Do not stand in the platform.

- 72 Fully lower the platform.
- 73 Place a 2x4 or similar piece of wood under both wheels on one side and drive the machine up onto them.
- 74 Raise the platform approximately 7 ft / 2.1 m from the ground.
- ⊙ Result: The platform should stop and the tilt alarm will sound at 180 beeps per minute. The platform controls LED readout should display LL and the ground controls LCD should display LL: Machine Tilted.
- 75 Press the drive function button (if equipped). 
- 76 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 77 Move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, then move the control handle in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.
- ⊙ Result: The drive function should not work in either direction.
- 78 Lower the platform and remove both pieces of wood.

# Inspections

## Test Elevated Drive Speed

79 Raise the platform approximately 4 ft / 1.2 m from the ground.

80 Press the drive function button (if equipped).



81 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle. Slowly move the control handle to full drive position.

- ⊙ Result: The maximum achievable drive speed with the platform raised should not exceed 0.72 ft / 22 cm per second.

If the drive speed with the platform raised exceeds 0.72 ft / 22 cm per second, immediately tag and remove the machine from service.

## Test the Pothole Guards

Note: The pothole guards should automatically deploy when the platform is raised. The pothole guards activate limit switches that allow the machine to continue to function. If the pothole guards do not deploy, an alarm sounds and the machine will not drive or steer.

82 Raise the platform.

- ⊙ Result: When the platform is raised 4 ft / 1.2 m from the ground, the pothole guards should deploy.

83 Press on the pothole guards on one side, and then the other.

- ⊙ Result: The pothole guards should not move.

84 Lower the platform.

- ⊙ Result: The pothole guards should return to the stowed position.

85 Place a 2x4 or similar piece of wood under a pothole guard.

86 Raise the platform.

- ⊙ Result: Before the platform is raised 7 ft / 2.1 m from the ground, an alarm should sound. The platform controls LED readout should display PHS and the ground controls LCD should display PHS: Pothole Guard Stuck.

87 Press the drive function button (if equipped).



88 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.

89 Slowly move the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue arrow, then in the direction indicated by the yellow arrow.

- ⊙ Result: The machine should not move forward or backward.

90 Press the drive function button (if equipped).



91 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.

92 Press the thumb rocker switch on top of the control handle in the direction indicated by the blue and yellow triangles on the control panel.

- ⊙ Result: The steer wheels should not turn left or right.

93 Lower the platform.

## Workplace Inspection Fundamentals

The workplace inspection helps the operator determine if the workplace is suitable for safe machine operation. It should be performed by the operator prior to moving the machine to the workplace.

It is the operator's responsibility to read and remember the workplace hazards, then watch for and avoid them while moving, setting up, and operating the machine.

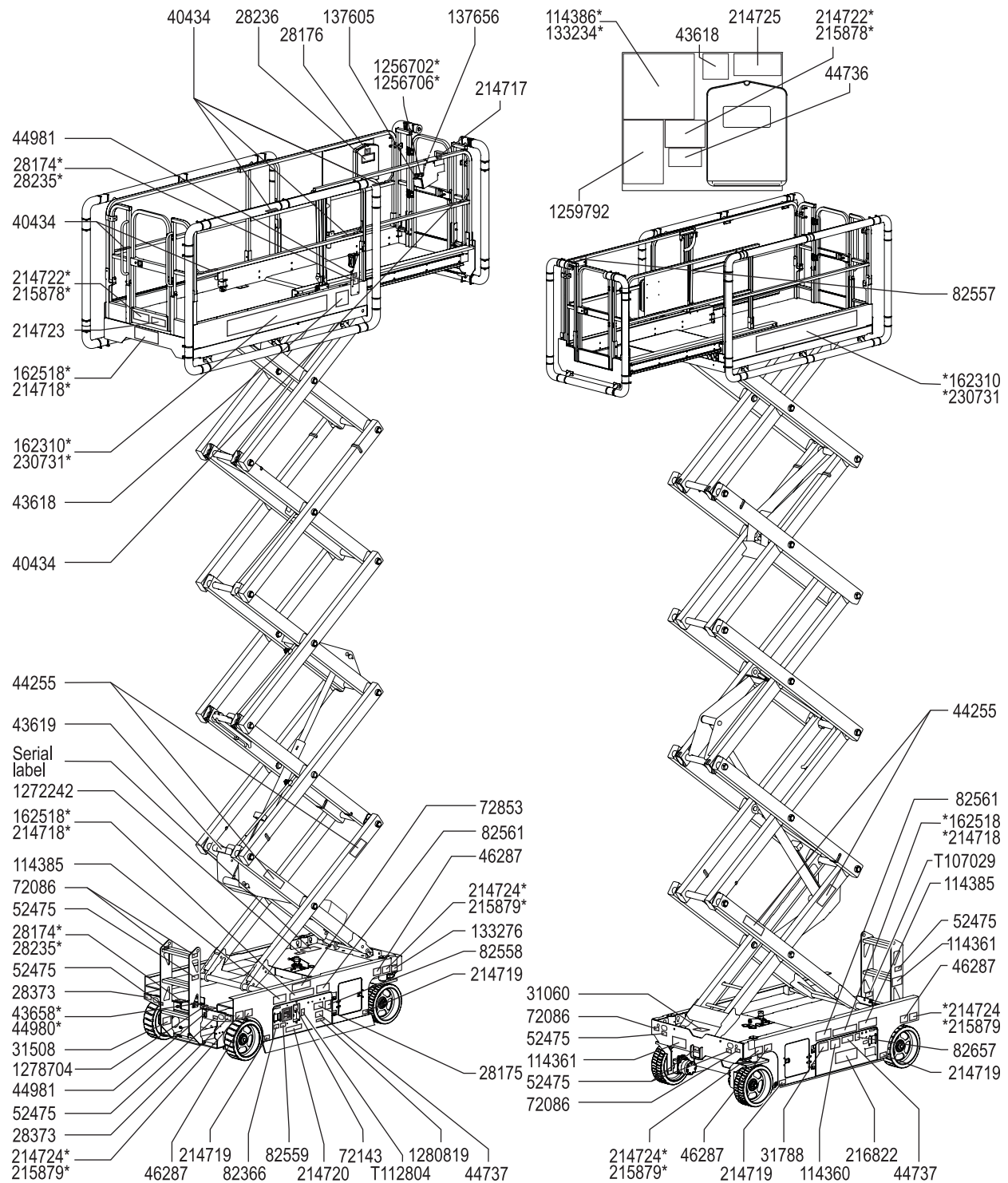

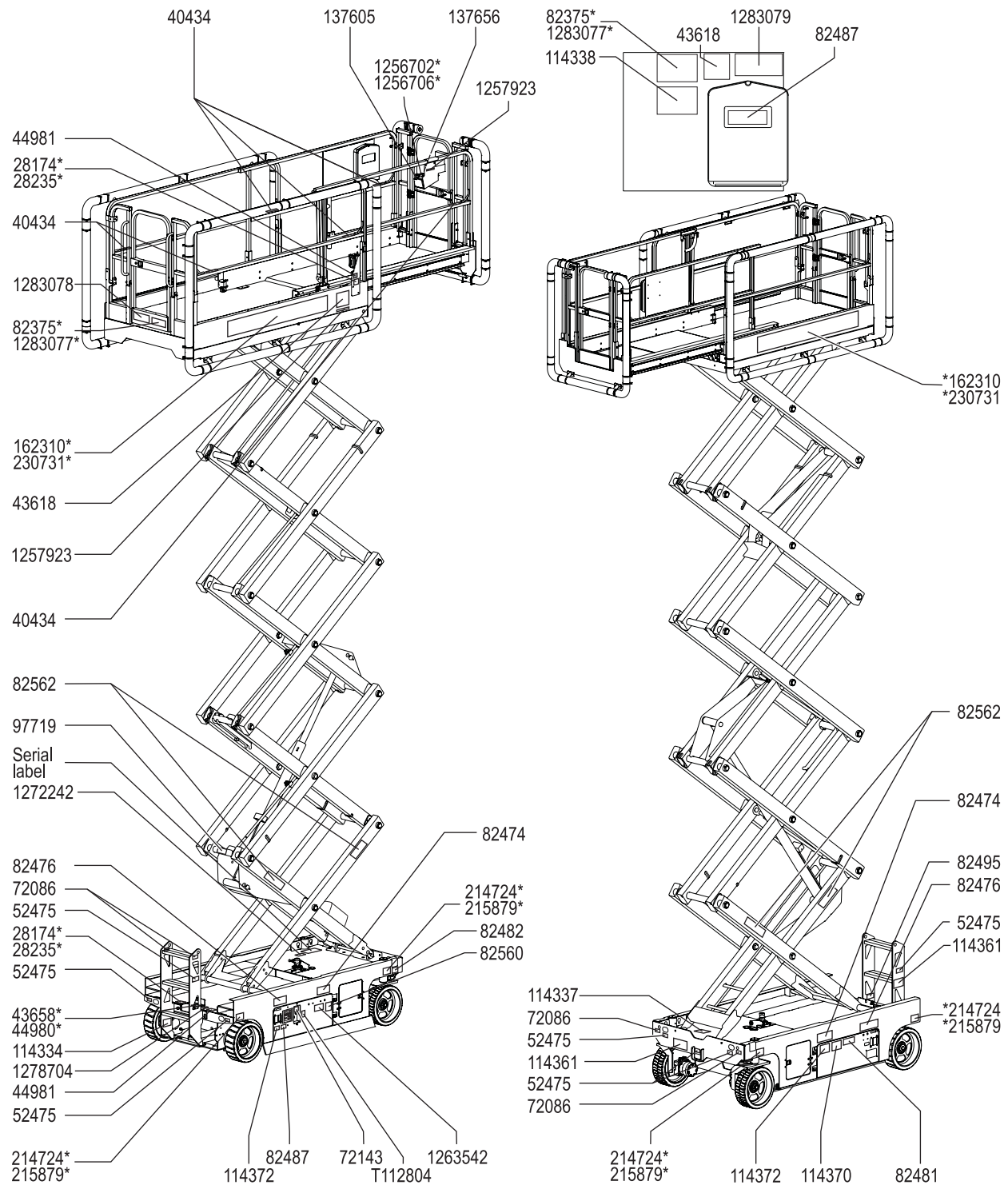

# Operating Instructions



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## Do Not Operate Unless:

- ☒ You learn and practice the principles of safe machine operation contained in this operator's manual.
- 1 Avoid hazardous situations.
- 2 Always perform a pre-operation inspection.
- 3 Always perform function tests prior to use.
- 4 Inspect the workplace.
- 5 **Only use the machine as it was intended.**

## Fundamentals

The Operating Instructions section provides instructions for each aspect of machine operation. It is the operator's responsibility to follow all the safety rules and instructions in the operator's, safety, and responsibilities manuals.

Using the machine for anything other than lifting personnel, along with their tools and materials, to an aerial work site is unsafe and dangerous.

Only trained and authorized personnel should be permitted to operate a machine. If more than one operator is expected to use a machine at different times in the same work shift, they must all be qualified operators and are all expected to follow all safety rules and instructions in the operator's, safety, and responsibilities manuals. That means every new operator should perform a pre-operation inspection, function tests, and a workplace inspection before using the machine.

## Operating Instructions

### Emergency Stop

Push in the red Emergency Stop button to the off position at the ground controls or the platform controls to stop all functions.

Repair any function that operates when either red Emergency Stop button is pushed in.

### Emergency Lowering

- 1 Pull the emergency lowering knob to lower the platform.

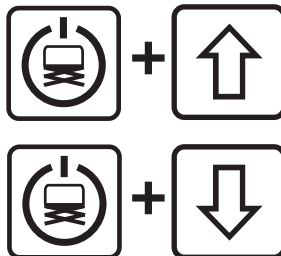
### Operation from Ground

- 1 Be sure the battery pack is connected before operating the machine.
- 2 Turn the selector switch to ground control.
- 3 Pull out both ground and platform red Emergency Stop buttons to the on position.

### To Position Platform

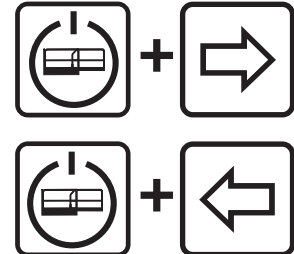
- 1 Press and hold the lift enable button.
- 2 Press the platform up or platform down button.

Drive and steer functions are not available from the ground controls.



### To Position Powered Extension Deck (if equipped)

- 1 Press and hold the powered extension deck enable button.
- 2 Press the extend or retract button.



Note: The lift function is disabled when the extension deck is deployed.

## Operation from Platform

- 1 Be sure the battery pack is connected before operating the machine.
- 2 Turn the selector switch to platform control.
- 3 Pull out both ground and platform red Emergency Stop buttons to the on position.

## To Position Platform

- 1 Press the lift function button. On the LCD screen, a circle below the lift function symbol will turn on.

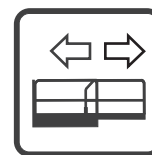


If the control handle is not moved within seven seconds of pushing the lift function button, the circle below the lift function symbol will turn off and lift function will not operate. Press the lift function button again.

- 2 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle.
- 3 Machines equipped with foot switch: Press and hold the foot switch and press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle at the same time.
- 4 Move the control handle according to the markings on the control panel.

## To Position Powered Extension Deck (if equipped)

- 1 Press the powered extension deck function button.
- 2 Move the control handle in the direction indicated on the control panel.



Note: The drive and lift function are disabled when the extension deck is deployed and/or when the platform gates are in the open position. The extension deck must be in the stowed position and the platform gates fully closed before operating the drive and lift functions.

Note: The powered extension deck extend and retract functions are disabled when the platform gates are in the open position. The platform gates must be fully closed before operating the powered extension deck extend and retract functions.

## To Position Platform Extension Deck

- 1 Lift the platform extension lock handle to the horizontal position.
- 2 Push the platform extension lock handle to extend the platform to the desired position.
- 3 Pull the platform extension lock handle to retract the platform to the desired position.

Do not stand on the platform extension deck during deployment.

- 4 Lower the platform extension lock handle to lock the extension platform in place.

Note: The drive and lift function are disabled when the extension deck is deployed and/or when the platform gates are in the open position. The extension deck must be in the stowed position and the platform gates fully closed before operating the drive and lift functions.

# Operating Instructions

## To Steer

- 1 Press the drive function button. On the LCD screen, a circle below the drive function symbol will turn on.

If the control handle is not moved within seven seconds of pushing the drive function button, the circle below the drive function symbol will turn off and drive function will not operate. Press the drive function button again.

- 2 Press and hold the foot switch (if equipped).
- 3 Turn the steer wheels with the thumb rocker switch located on the top of the control handle.



## To Drive

- 1 Press the drive function button. On the LCD screen, a circle below the drive function symbol will turn on.

If the control handle is not moved within seven seconds of pushing the drive function button, the circle below the drive function symbol will turn off and drive function will not operate. Press the drive function button again.

- 2 Machines equipped with foot switch: Press and hold the foot switch and press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle at the same time.

- 3 Increase speed: Slowly move the control handle off center.

Decrease speed: Slowly move the control handle toward center.

Stop: Return the control handle to center or release the function enable switch.

Use the color-coded direction arrows on the platform controls and on the platform to identify the direction the machine will travel.

Machine travel speed is restricted when the platform is raised.

Battery condition will affect machine performance. Machine drive speed and function speed will drop when the battery level indicator is flashing.

# Operating Instructions

## To select drive speed

The drive controls can operate in two different drive speed modes while in the stowed position. When the drive speed button light is on, slow drive speed mode is active. When the drive speed button light is off, fast drive speed mode is active.

Press the drive speed button to select the desired drive speed.



Note: When the platform is elevated, the drive speed button light is always on, indicating elevated drive speed.

## ▲ Driving on a slope

Determine the slope and side slope ratings for the machine and determine the slope grade.

### Maximum slope rating, stowed position:

Note: Slope rating is subject to ground conditions and adequate traction.

Press the drive speed button to the fast drive speed mode.

## To determine the slope grade:

Measure the slope with a digital inclinometer OR use the following procedure.

You will need:

- carpenter's level
- straight piece of wood, at least 3 feet/1 m long
- tape measure

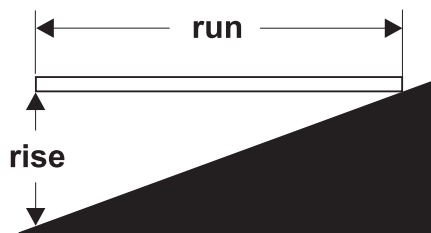
Lay the piece of wood on the slope.

At the downhill end, lay the level on the top edge of the piece of wood and lift the end until the piece of wood is level.

While holding the piece of wood level, measure the vertical distance from the bottom of the piece of wood to the ground.

Divide the tape measure distance (rise) by the length of the piece of wood (run) and multiply by 100.

Example:



Piece of wood = 144 inches (3.6 m)

Run = 144 inches (3.6 m)

Rise = 12 inches (0.3 m)

$12 \text{ in} \div 144 \text{ in} = 0.083 \times 100 = 8.3\% \text{ grade}$

$0.3 \text{ m} \div 3.6 \text{ m} = 0.083 \times 100 = 8.3\% \text{ grade}$

If the slope exceeds the maximum slope or side slope rating, then the machine must be winched or transported up or down the slope. See Transport and Lifting section.

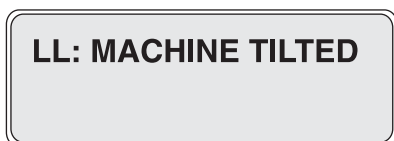

## Operational indicator codes

If the platform controls LED or ground controls LCD diagnostic readout displays an operational indicator code such as LL, the fault condition must be repaired or removed before resuming machine operation. Push in and pull out the red Emergency Stop button to reset the system.

## Operation from Ground with Controller

Maintain safe distances between the operator, machine and fixed objects.

Be aware of the direction the machine will travel when using the controller.

## Battery Level Indicator

Use the LED diagnostic readout to determine the battery level.

Note: When a blinking LO code appears on the platform controls LED display, the machine must be taken out of service and charged, otherwise all machine functions will be disabled.

## How to Use the Safety Arm

- 1 Raise the platform approximately 8 ft / 2.4 m from the ground.
- 2 Rotate the safety arm away from the machine and let it hang down.
- 3 Lower the platform until the safety arm rests securely on the link. Keep clear of the safety arm when lowering the platform.

## Battery and Charger Instructions

### Observe and Obey:

- ☒ Do not use an external charger or booster battery if machine is equipped with a Genie charger.
- ☒ Charge the battery in a well-ventilated area.
- ☒ Use proper AC input voltage for charging as indicated on the onboard charger.
- ☒ If replacing onboard charger or batteries, use only Genie authorized components.
- ☒ Remote chargers must be compatible with Genie batteries.

### To Charge Battery

- 1 Be sure the batteries are connected before charging the batteries.
- 2 Open the battery compartment. The compartment should remain open for the entire charging cycle.

### Maintenance-free batteries

- 1 Connect the battery charger to a grounded AC circuit.
- 2 The onboard charger will automatically shut off when charging cycle is complete.

### Standard Batteries

- 1 Remove the battery vent caps and check the battery acid level. If necessary, add only enough distilled water to cover the plates. Do not overfill prior to the charge cycle.
- 2 Replace the battery vent caps.
- 3 Connect the battery charger to a grounded AC circuit.
- 4 The onboard charger will automatically shut off when charging cycle is complete.
- 5 Check the battery acid level when the charging cycle is complete. Replenish with distilled water to the bottom of the fill tube. Do not overfill.

### Dry Battery Filling and Charging Instructions

- 1 Remove the battery vent caps and permanently remove the plastic seal from the battery vent openings.
- 2 Fill each cell with battery acid (electrolyte) until the level is sufficient to cover the plates.

Do not fill to maximum level until the battery charge cycle is complete. Overfilling can cause the battery acid to overflow during charging. Neutralize battery acid spills with baking soda and water.

- 3 Install the battery vent caps.
- 4 Charge the battery.
- 5 Check the battery acid level when the charging cycle is complete. Replenish with distilled water to the bottom of the fill tube. Do not overfill.

## Transport and Lifting Instructions



### Observe and Obey:

- ☑ Genie provides this securement information as a recommendation. Drivers are solely responsible for making sure machines are properly secured and the correct trailer is selected pursuant to US Department of Transportation regulations, other localized regulations, and their company policy.
- ☑ Genie customers needing to containerize any lift or Genie product should source a qualified freight forwarder with expertise in preparing, loading and securing construction and lifting equipment for international shipment.
- ☑ Only qualified aerial lift operators should move the machine on or off the truck.
- ☑ The transport vehicle must be parked on a level surface.
- ☑ The transport vehicle must be secured to prevent rolling while the machine is being loaded.
- ☑ Be sure the vehicle capacity, loading surfaces and chains or straps are sufficient to withstand the machine weight. Genie lifts are very heavy relative to their size. See the serial label for the machine weight.
- ☑ The machine must be on a level surface or secured before releasing the brakes.
- ☑ Do not allow the rails to fall when the snap pins are removed. Maintain a firm grasp on the rails when the rails are lowered.
- ☑ Do not drive the machine on a slope that exceeds the uphill, downhill or side slope rating. See Driving on a Slope in the Operating Instructions section.
- ☑ If the slope of the transport vehicle bed exceeds the maximum slope rating, the machine must be loaded and unloaded using a winch as described in the brake release operation.

## Transport and Lifting Instructions

### Brake Release Operation

- 1 Chock the wheels to prevent the machine from rolling. 
- 2 Be sure the winch line is properly secured to the drive chassis tie points and the path is clear of all obstructions.
- 3 Push in the black brake release knob to open the brake valve. 
- 4 Pump the red brake release pump knob.

After the machine is loaded:

- 1 Chock the wheels to prevent the machine from rolling.
- 2 Pull out the red Emergency Stop button at both the ground and platform controls to the on position, and turn the key switch to the platform position.
- 3 Press the drive function button (if equipped). 
- 4 Press and hold the function enable switch on the control handle. Move the control handle off center and immediately release it to reset the brakes.
- 5 Push the red Emergency stop button at both the ground and platform controls to the off position.

Towing the Genie GS-2646 AV and GS-2646 AV35 is not recommended. If the machine must be towed, do not exceed 2 mph / 3.2 km/h.

## Transport and Lifting Instructions

### Securing to Truck or Trailer for Transit

Always use the extension deck lock when the machine is transported.

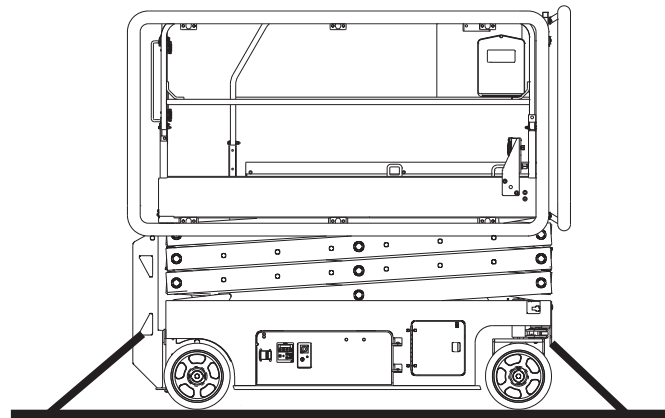
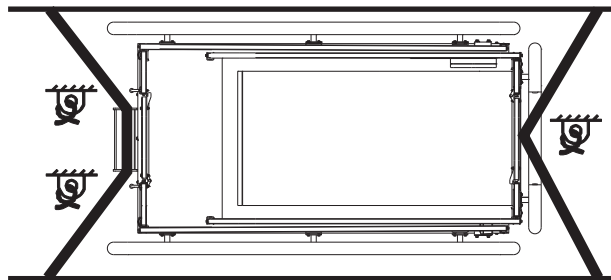
Turn the selector switch to the off position before transporting.

Inspect the entire machine for loose or unsecured items.

Use chains or straps of ample load capacity.

Use a minimum of 2 chains or straps.

Adjust the rigging to prevent damage to the chains.

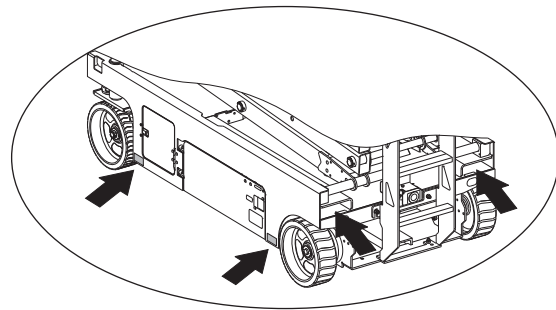

- ☑ Only qualified forklift operators should lift the machine with a forklift rated to lift the machine weight.
- ☑ Be sure the crane capacity, loading surfaces and straps or lines are sufficient to withstand the machine weight. See the serial label for the machine weight.

### Lifting the Machine with a Forklift

Be sure the extension deck, controls and component trays are secure. Remove all loose items on the machine.

Fully lower the platform. The platform must remain lowered during all loading and transport procedures.

Use the forklift pockets located on both sides of the ladder.



Align the forklift forks with the forklift pockets.

Drive forward to the full extent of the forks.

Raise the machine 16 in / 0.4 m and then tilt the forks back slightly to keep the machine secure.

Be sure the machine is level when lowering the forks.

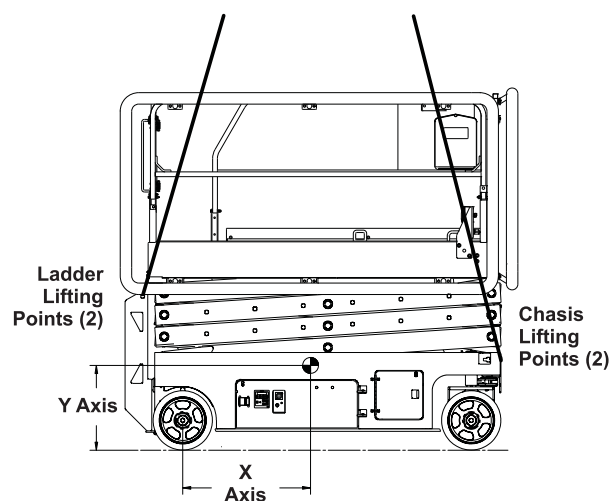

Attach the rigging only to the designated lifting points on the machine. There are two 1 inch / 2.5 cm holes on the front of the machine and two holes in the ladder for lifting.

Adjust the rigging to prevent damage to the machine and to keep the machine level.

## Check the Hydraulic Oil Level



Maintaining the hydraulic oil at the proper level is essential to machine operation. Improper hydraulic oil levels can damage hydraulic components. Daily checks allow the inspector to identify changes in oil level that might indicate the presence of hydraulic system problems.

- 1 Be sure that the machine is on a firm, level surface, free of obstructions, with the platform in the stowed position.
- 2 Visually inspect the oil level in the hydraulic oil tank.
- ⊙ Result: The hydraulic oil level should be between the ADD and FULL marks on the tank.
- 3 Add oil as needed. Do not overfill.

# Maintenance

## Check the Batteries



Proper battery condition is essential to good machine performance and operational safety. Improper fluid levels or damaged cables and connections can result in component damage and hazardous conditions.

- ▲ **Electrocution hazard.** Contact with hot or live circuits may result in death or serious injury. Remove all rings, watches and other jewelry.
- ▲ **Bodily injury hazard.** Batteries contain acid. Avoid spilling or contacting battery acid. Neutralize battery acid spills with baking soda and water.

**Note:** Perform this test after fully charging the batteries.

- 1 Put on protective clothing and eye wear.
- 2 Be sure that the battery cable connections are tight and free of corrosion.
- 3 Be sure that the battery hold-down brackets are in place and secure.

**Note:** Adding terminal protectors and a corrosion preventative sealant will help eliminate the corrosion on the battery terminals and cables.

## Scheduled Maintenance

Maintenance performed quarterly, annually and every two years must be completed by a person trained and qualified to perform maintenance on this machine according to the procedures found in the service manual for this machine.

Machines that have been out of service for more than three months must receive the quarterly inspection before they are put back into service.
